1			<p>We are a licensed contractor in the state of Louisiana. Do we have to be licensed in the State of Mississippi in order to be considered for this project?</p>	<p>That is not a requirement detailed in this IFB. However this clause will appear in the contract and the Contractor must meet these requirements:</p> <p>Authority to Contract:</p> <p>The Contractor warrants (a) that it is a validly organized business with valid authority to enter into this agreement; (b) that entry into and performance under this agreement is not restricted or prohibited by any loan, security, financing, contractual, or other agreement of any kind, and (c) notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement to the contrary, that there are no existing legal proceeding or prospective legal proceedings, either voluntary or otherwise, which may adversely affect its ability to perform its obligations under this agreement.</p>

2			<p>What is the amount of cultch that is to be deployed and does it have to be a certain mixture of the materials stated?</p>	<p>This will be provided by the contractor when the bid is submitted on page 5 of the IFB. The contractor will fill in the unit price per cubic yard, the total cubic yards of cultch material and those two multiplied together give you the total price (Not To Exceed \$97,000.00) . The award will be given to the contractor providing the most cultch material at the lowest price per cubic yard NTE \$97,000. The types of cultch and size and percentages are all provided on page one under Types of Cultch.</p>
3			<p>What are the GPS coordinates of the oyster grounds and is there a map of the area where the project is taking place?</p>	<p>The DMR is determining an exact area at this time. It will be within a mile of Deer Island on the north side and covers approximately 17 acres.</p>
