- **Location: Greenwood Island Beneficial Use (BU) Site, MS Sound, Pascagoula, Jackson County, Mississippi.**
- **Use District: (I) Industrial Use District**
- **Agent: Renee Robertson, Anchor QEA**

Project Description

- **Expansion of the existing 20 acre BU site at Greenwood Island to include approximately 219 acres of capacity by the construction of an 11,000-linear-foot rock containment dike with a maximum crest elevation of +3' Mean Lower Low Water (MLLW). The entire site, including the berm, will be approximately 239 acres.**

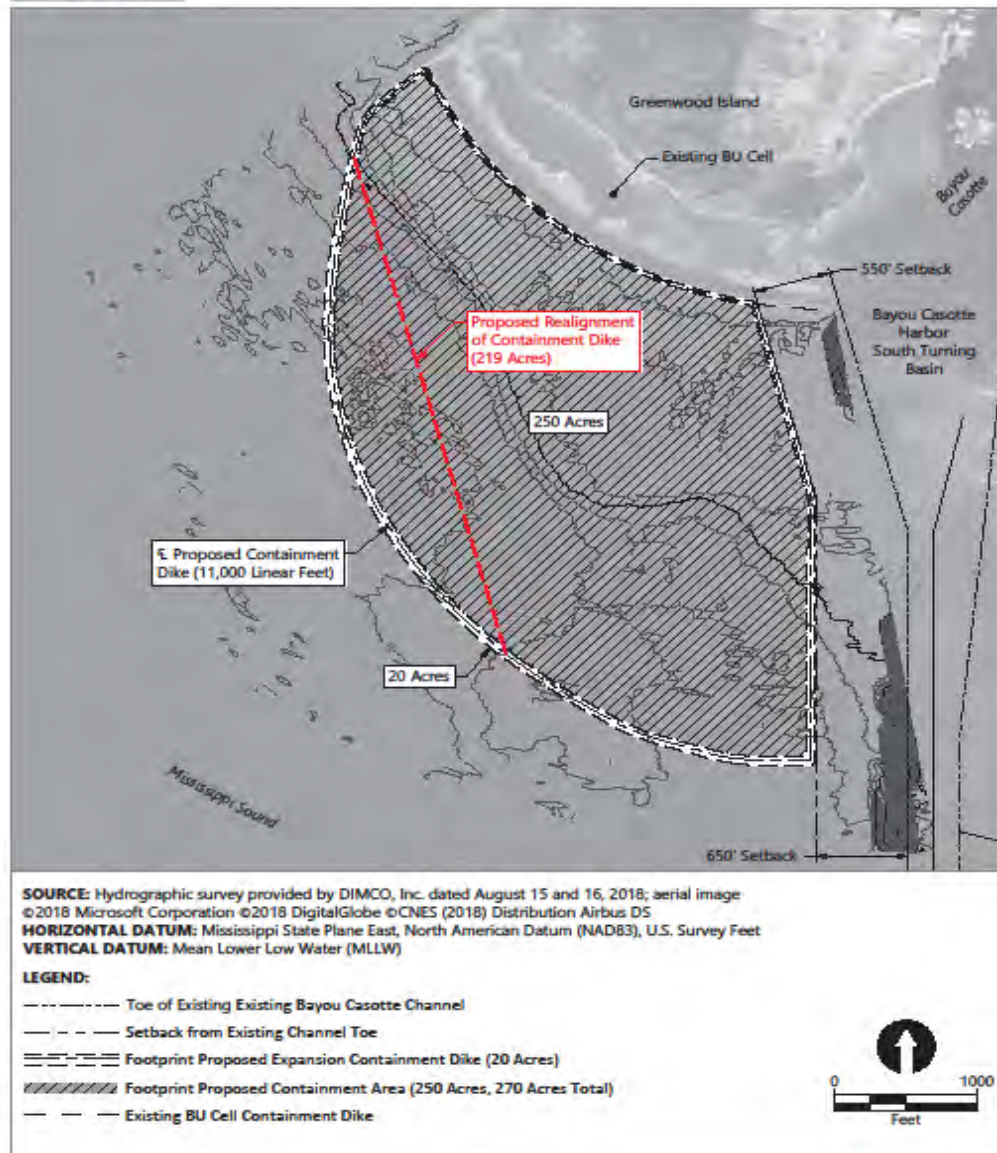

- **c) Variance...**
 - **Ch. VIII, Sect. 08, 114.01 and Miss. Admin. Code Title 22, Part 23, Ch. 8, Section 114.01**
 - “Permanent filling of coastal wetlands...is discouraged.”
 - **Justified under Ch. VIII, Sect. 08, 118.01 and Miss. Admin. Code Title 22, Part 23, Ch. 8, Section 118.01**
 - **Impacts to Coastal Wetlands would be no worse than if the guidelines were followed**
 - The filling of shallow water bottoms is being conducted to support ecological restoration which will provide a net positive environmental impact by creating productive tidal marsh and associated upland habitats

 - Public Notice
 - Notification of the proposed project appeared in The Sun Herald and The Mississippi Press on September 20, 2019, September 27, 2019, and October 4, 2019
 - A public hearing was held on Tuesday, October 29, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. at the Pelican Landing Event and Conference Center located at 6217 MS-613, Moss Point, Mississippi
 - MS DEQ: Has issued 401 Water Quality Certification
 - MS DAH: Requested that a Cultural Resources Survey be performed. The survey was completed, submitted to MDAH, and they have stated they have no objections to the proposed project
 - MS SOS: Project will require a Tidelands Lease
 - MS DWFP: No comments were submitted within the comment period

- **Several public comments were received concerning:**
 - Alternative analysis and consideration for other proposed site locations
 - Negative impacts to aesthetic value and reduced viewshed
 - Diminished property value as a result of the project
 - Potential effluent and sedimentation of existing channel as a result of the dredged material disposal
 - Request for a guarantee in the conditions of the permit that the dredged material to be placed within the site will be sourced exclusively from Jackson County

- **I) Comments...**

- **Several public comments were received concerning:**
 - Request for a guarantee in the conditions of the permit to provide maintenance dredging within the adjacent bayous and canals in perpetuity
 - Possibility of the County dredging the existing canals to -10 feet in depth to reduce the frequency of future dredging projects
 - Concerns that future disposal will include potentially contaminated material
 - Negative impacts to existing sailboat racecourse located south of Greenwood Island

Recommendation

- Based upon departmental review and evaluation, it has been determined that the project will have a significant public benefit, therefore, staff recommends approval of the variance requests and issuance of a Permit
