## **Current Recreational Spotted Seatrout Regulations**

Spotted Seatrout must be a minimum of 15 inches total length (TL) to harvest, with a daily bag limit of 15 fish per person.

## **Current Commercial Spotted Seatrout Regulations**

Spotted Seatrout must be a minimum length of 14 inches TL to harvest

- Annual Quota: 50,000 pounds
- Commercial fishermen have a 50,000-pound quota, and their Spotted Seatrout season closes once this is reached.
- The commercial fishery is open from January 1<sup>st</sup> December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year until the quota is met.
- Commercial fishermen are not allowed to fish north of the CSX railroad.
- Additionally, commercial fishermen are not allowed to fish within one mile of Ship, Horn, or Petit Bois Islands.
- In addition to having a commercial license, individuals harvesting Spotted Seatrout for sale must possess a Spotted Seatrout Endorsement.
- To qualify for this endorsement an application must be completed and submitted to the Finfish Bureau Trip Ticket Program officer. You can find the application by clicking on the link below:

## Frequently Asked Questions About Spotted Seatrout

- 1. When did the Spotted Seatrout minimum total length change to 15 inches?
  - The implementation date for the current regulation was January 16, 2017
- 2. What have we seen with Spotted Seatrout fishery since the regulation change?
  - Stock assessments have shown increases in the resiliency of the stock and total biomass.
  - Despite the yearly increase in recreational fishing effort in the Spotted Seatrout fishery, recent stock assessments have shown positive trends in biomass.
- 3. Can you transport and land Spotted Seatrout that meet the minimum size and creel limits of an adjacent states' waters?
  - Yes, but the fishermen must possess a valid saltwater fishing license of the state where the fish were caught and cannot stop in Mississippi territorial waters to fish prior to landing.
- 4. Where to catch Spotted Seatrout?
  - Fish around sea grass beds, dock pilings, bridge pilings, oyster beds, and sand bars in coastal waters, bays, bayous, and estuaries

- 5. How old is a 15-inch Spotted Seatrout?
  - It depends on the sex and productivity level of the region, but the majority of the Spotted Seatrout are between 1.5 year and 2.5 years old when 15 inches long.
- 6. When do Spotted Seatrout reach sexual maturity?
  - Female Spotted Seatrout reach 50% sexual maturity around 10.5 inches. Male Spotted Seatrout are 100% mature at 9 inches.
