
Project Description

- Creation of Boat Ramp and Associated Piers, Canal, and Parking Area
 - Fill:
 - 0.0108 acre of Coastal Wetlands (tidal marsh) Boat ramp
 - 0.05 acre of non-tidal wetlands Parking area
 - Boat Ramp: 20' in width; 96 cubic yards fill (unvegetated water bottoms)
 - Dredging (canal): 336' x 30'
 - Current depth: 2' MLLW
 - Proposed depth: 4.5' MLLW
 - Piers (2): Each 70' x 5'
 - Breakwater: 70' vinyl or timber

Applicable Decision Factors

- c) Variance to the MS Coastal Program...
 - Miss. Admin. Code Title 22, Part 23, Chapter 8, Section 101.01,114.01, and 117.3
 - 101.01.."(Boat Ramps) Must be located in areas which do not require the destruction of sensitive coastal wetlands..."
 - 114.01.. "Permanent filling of coastal wetlands below the mean high tide line because of potential adverse and cumulative environmental impacts is not authorized"
 - 117.3.."A minimum ten-foot (10-foot) buffer must be maintained between dredging/excavation and any wetlands"
 - This variance request was justified under Miss. Admin. Code Title 22, Part 23, Chapter 8, Section 118.04
 - states "The activity requires a waterfront location; there is a significant public benefit in the activity; and a public hearing has been held."

Applicable Decision Factors continued

• e) The extent to which the proposed activity affects biological integrity of coastal wetlands...

Mitigation Proposed

- 3:1 ratio: 1,587 square feet
- Debris removal: Litter cleanup
- Planting of S. alterniflora and J. roemerianus
 - Will transplant impacted vegetation
 - In accordance with MDMR's Marsh Restoration and Creation Guidelines


