**About the Position**

The primary duty of a Seafood Officer is to conduct technical assistance and inspections of seafood facilities and/or modes of transportation within the State for compliance with Federal and State regulations. The goal is to ensure the safety of seafood for public consumption. Seafood processors and dealers must meet the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations for seafood processing and shipping interstate and intrastate commerce. Seafood Officers are expected to professionally interact with members of the seafood industry and speak before large and small groups. The incumbent will be offered training to develop the knowledge and skills necessary to interpret Federal regulations including the National Shellfish Sanitation Program (NSSP) Guide for the Control of Molluscan Shellfish, Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP), and Title 22 State regulations. The duties are performed using good judgment and discretion under the direct supervision of the immediate supervisor and at the direction of the Bureau Director, Deputy Directors, and Office Director. Work will be reviewed through regular meetings and conferences. This is a time limited position.

**What you'll need to be Successful**

Knowledge of sanitation principles; develops knowledge of the laws, rules, and ordinances as they relate to the seafood processing plant inspection programs. Ability for cooperative community engagement and commitment to promoting Mississippi's seafood industry food safety.
