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Actions Update for August 15, 2023 Commission Meeting

Discussed at the July 2023 meeting:

- The Commission recommended and the Director approved the following motions:
- 1) Motion to recommend that the requested variance and permit be issued to the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources Beneficial Use of Dredged Material Program to fill approximately 660 acres of Coastal Wetlands (unvegetated water bottoms) to construct a beneficial use of dredge material site in the MS Sound on the southeastern side of Cat Island, Harrison County, Mississippi.
- 2) Ronnie Daniels was elected as Chairperson and Cam Roberds was elected as Vice-Chair for FY 2024.

3) Approval of the following State Saltwater Finfish Records:

- a. Conventional Tackle
 - 1. Whitebone Porgy (*Calamus leucosteus*) 2 lbs. 8.8 oz. Connie Boykin
 - 2. Yellowtail Snapper (*Ocyurus chrysurus*) 7 lbs. 9.6 oz. Gavin Friend
- b. Youth Conventional Tackle




Project Chronology for Violation

- April 18, 2023: MDMR was informed of a possible violation at the address and a site visit was performed that revealed:
 - Several piers constructed out of compliance or without authorization
- April 19, 2023: MDMR sent Notice of Violation to applicant and agent
 - Informed them of non-compliance issue:
 - Piers not constructed to permitted dimensions or constructed without authorization

Project Chronology for Violation

• April 20, 2023: Request for After-the-Fact authorization for the piers submitted to the MDMR by the agent

 April 21, 2023: MDMR sent Request for Review of After-the-Fact Application to Coastal Program Agencies, MS SOS, and USACE

Recommendation for Piers

- The staff of the Department of Marine Resources has conducted an evaluation of the existing and proposed structures. Because the piers would have been eligible for a Certificate of Exclusion, staff recommends:
 - Approval for the piers as constructed

NFWF Barrier Island Reef Project

- 860 reef modules deployed on FH-8, 9/11, 10, and Cat Island.
- Initial deployments occurred on April 18th and 19th with final construction completed on July 17th and 18th.
- The modules are constructed on concrete bases using rebar and Florida limestone.







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Offshore Artificial Reef Sites



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
