

Background

- Coastal Migratory Pelagic
 - Broad Distribution
- Management is split across zones
 - Gulf
 - FLEC
 - Atlantic
- Mississippi's current regulations
 - Minimum size 36" FL
 - 2 fish per person per day



Pertinent Regulations and Statutes

- MS Code § 49-15-3
 - "Game fish" means cobia, also known as ling or lemonfish (*Rachycentron canadum*). The cobia is classified as game fish.
- MS Code § 49-15-76
 - It is unlawful for any person to sell, barter or trade or to offer for sale, barter or trade any game fish.
- Title 22 Part 3 Chapter 8 section T
 - It is unlawful to sell, offer for sale, barter, trade, or purchase cobia landed in Mississippi.
- Size and bag limits
 - 36" FL (adopted in 2020)
 - 2 fish per person per day

Recent Assessment and Regulations


- Length limit change to 36"FL (2020)
- SEDAR 28 (2021)
 - Overfishing occurring since 1975
 - Harvest reduced by 33%
- Federal Bag and Vessel limits established
 - 1 per person, 2 per vessel regardless of sector
- State and federal regulations to date









MRIP Landings – MS and Gulfwide
