Actions Update for March 19, 2024 Commission Meeting

Discussed at the February 2024 meeting:

- The Commission recommended and the Director approved the following motions:
- Motion to recommend approval of the requested variance and permit for the Jackson County Port Authority located in wetlands adjacent to the Escatawpa River near Highway 63 in Moss Point, Jackson County, MS. The project includes the fill of 3.27 acres of tidal or tidally influenced marsh to construct a railway that will allow more efficient movement of goods by rail from Bayou Casotte and the Port of Pascagoula and increase public safety through the abandonment of 21 railroad crossings through Moss Point and Pascagoula.

• Motion to recommend approval of the requested variance, use plan change and permit for the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources to create a beneficial use site located at Railroad Corner near the mouth of the Pascagoula River, Jackson County, MS. The project will create approximately 175 acres of tidal marsh habitat and provide an additional site for the placement of dredged materials.
