#### Discussed at the February 2025 meeting:

The Commission recommended and the Director approved:

Motion that the Commission recommend and the Executive Director:

Approve the staff recommendation to establish a No Wake Zone for the proposed Wolf River bridge and boat launch at Menge Avenue based on normal operation and vessel speed in relation to the public access areas in which people fish, boat and socialize.



• The Commission recommended and the Director approved:

A permit requested by the MDMR for the filling of coastal wetlands for the construction of a submerged artificial reef located approximately two miles north of Petit Bois Island, including:

- a. The requested variance; and
- b. Conditioned on the MDMR coordinating with US Coast Guard for necessary navigational aids at the project location
